Nature Power Foundation (NPF) is a non-profit organization created in 2017 as part of a social innovation seeking to improve living conditions and contribute to the sustainable development of communities experiencing extreme poverty in the Dominican Republic and the Caribbean. NPF facilitates access to basic energy services, drinking water and solar entrepreneurship through alternative energy sources that protect the environment.

NPF was incorporated pursuant to the mandate of Law 122-05 for the promotion and regulation of Non-Profit Associations in the Dominican Republic.

Our actions respond to the national planning instruments embodied in the National Development Strategy (END 2030) and, at the international level, contribute to the achievement of the commitments assumed by the countries in the 2030 agenda and impact on the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs):

Some **300 people** benefited from water for the first time in their homes in Los Cambrones, San Juan de la Maguana, D.R.



Thanks to **international solidary donors**, to the empowerment of the Los Cambrones community of SJM, to the contribution of the GEF Small Grants Program and the UNDP DR and to the work we do together with the Fundación para el Desarrollo de Azua, San Juan and Elías Piña (FUNDASEP) the construction of the community aqueduct with solar pumping was completed, which the families of the area had longed for for many years.

**The Solar Powered Pump System has an installed capacity of 2.1kw for 2.41 HP and an elevated storage and distribution tank, with 10,000 gallons capacity and 100 m<sup>3</sup>.**

## ★ WATER IN SAN JUAN



The **Asociación Cibao de Ahorros y Prestamos**, within the framework of its Corporate Social Responsibility program, celebrates each year its ACAP Competitive Funds for Sustainable Development program and, on its third call, eight NPOs were winners in the categories: Social, Economic and Environmental. At Nature Power Foundation, we won in the environmental category to develop in the community of Los Corocitos, San Juan de la Maguana, a project to replace the aqueduct's electric generation system that was useless with a new pumping system with solar energy.





# The Stars that Shined

In Los Corocitos, Las Matas de Farfán in the Province of San Juan de la Maguana, **130 families** benefited from water thanks to the new aqueduct with solar pumping.



The change of the electrical generation system of the community aqueduct for a new pumping system with solar energy allowed them to bring water to all the homes for use in the bathroom, kitchen, home cleaning and laundry, as well as for the rehabilitation of the reservoir or community lagoon that serves as a drinking trough for the small group of ranchers in this community. We executed the community development project together with our ally Plan RD.

With great enthusiasm, the community of Sabana Yegua Viejo worked on identifying their needs and potential solutions to jointly launch NATURE VILLAGE, a sustainable community that will operate with solar panels and will allow them to bridge their development gaps through access to energy, water and sanitation, home improvement, education, technology and sustainable entrepreneurs.

As this community was chosen as a pioneer that will operate entirely with solar panels, the **German and Canadian embassies in the DR** confirmed their commitment to contribute promoting this future sustainable project. Germany financed photovoltaic energy for all homes and Canada financed the community entrepreneurship component.



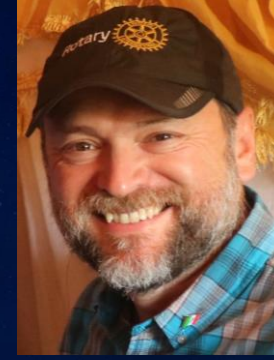
